

Paying for Child Care?



We have good news for you!

Beginning October 1st 2008, the Food Assistance Program (Bridge Card) through Department of Human Services will change how it counts your Child Care costs.

What does this mean for you?

If you have a Bridge Card **and pay** more than \$175 (per child) out of your own money for Child Care, the monthly amount you receive in Food Assistance could increase.

If you applied for a Bridge Card in the past but were denied, you could now qualify, **if you are** paying Child Care.
